

## Animals at risk from warming are on display

A photo show titled "Irreplaceable - Wildlife in a Warming World" opens today at the University of Washington's [Burke Museum](#). The exhibit is a photo display of sharks, birds, penguins, felines, reptiles and other creatures threatened as the world gets warmer.

The exhibit makes a clear call to action, urging letters to Congress and individual actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The associated Web site has an [interactive map](#) to find species at risk in your area, and includes this warning: "In some regions up to 60 percent of wildlife and plants could be at risk of extinction due to climate change."
